## **Dress to Impress**

*An activity of "Our Singapore: Sutra Chanting"*

### **INTRODUCTION**

From reading "Our Singapore: Sutra Chanting", we learn that members of the public have to dress appropriately before entering a temple. It is not solely places of worship that require people to dress respectfully. Many other places and events also call for visitors to dress well. For this activity, design an invitation to a formal event of your choice and include instructions for the dress code.

### **INSTRUCTIONS**

1. **PICK** an event that visitors or participants have to dress well for, and design an invitation to that event. Perhaps you would like to invite friends to a piano recital at the Esplanade, encourage other students to attend the Istana Art Event where they may meet the President, or ask your classmates to watch you perform in a play at the National Library's Drama Centre. If you can think of other similar events, you may use those as well.
2. **DESIGN** an invitation to your event, remembering to include details like the date, time and venue of the event. Think of colours, pictures and words that you could use to make the invitation look exciting and welcoming.
3. **ILLUSTRATE** the dress code on a separate slip of paper so that your guests know exactly what to wear. Give examples of the types of clothing that are suitable for the event, and also show examples of what is inappropriate. You can also draw the types of footwear that your guests should put on, and those they should avoid.
4. **SHARE** your finished invitation and dress code with your class. Explain to your class the reasons for your dress code and the design of your invitation.
