Egg It On

An activity of "Our Singapore: Baptism"

INTRODUCTION

Christians go through baptism to signify that they are ready for a new life with Christ. One symbol of new life that many of us are familiar with is the Easter egg. Play the Easter Egg Roll with your class, a traditional game enjoyed by children in different parts of the world. Expect a few twists in the version below!

INSTRUCTIONS

1. **PREPARE** about ten to twelve hardboiled eggs for this game. Do not remove the eggshells.
2. **FORM** groups of four to five members. Each group will be given one hardboiled egg.
3. **SET UP** an identical obstacle course for each group. Have a common starting line for all groups, and four cones placed one in front of the other for each group. The first cone should be about five metres from the start. The rest of the cones should be about a metre apart. The diagram shows how the course should look like.
4. **PLAY** the game. Taking turns, each team's member rolls their egg through the course and back to the starting line, where the next member takes over. This won't be easy as you can use only one hand to roll the egg, and do so while hopping on both feet like a bunny rabbit!
5. **WIN** the game by having all the members in your group complete the obstacle course first.
